A traveling exhibit
exploring the past,
present and future

North American mammal

Bison creates an interactive environment that combines history, artifacts and hands-on activities to bring to life the story of this great North American mammal. Completely self-contained, flexible and designed to travel, the exhibit can easily be installed in a variety of spaces, requiring at least 1200 sq ft.

This exhibit originally toured as **The Bison: American Icon** through the NEH on the Road program, based on a project by the C. M. Russell Museum, Great Falls, Montana. The National Buffalo Foundation acquired the exhibit at the end of this tour. Refurbished and updated, it will be available to museums across the US and Canada to tell the tragic history of this majestic animal, its rescue from extinction, and the story of people across North America working to preserve the bison as a vibrant part of our future.

Space Requirements: ~1000 sq ft

Cost: \$6,000 for up to 8 weeks plus inbound shipping. Additional weekly commitments negotiable.

Installation Assistance: One staff person arrives with the exhibit to assist host venue with installation.

Environment and Security: Host venue to assure a museum quality exhibit environment, with stable temperature and humidity, appropriate light levels and adequate security.

Crates and Storage: Designed around a modular system, the shipping crates serve as the exhibit units so there are a limited number of crates that require storage.
